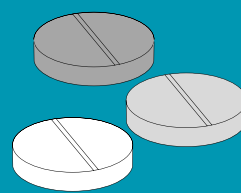


TRY THIS FOR CATS WHO HATE PILLS

1. GET YOUR RX

Use ONLY prescription meds given by your vet who knows your pet's medical history. Meds intended for another pet or for a human may be deadly to your pet.



2. AVOID HIDING IN MEALS

Hiding yucky meds in canned food can partially dissolve them and make food taste terrible. While this may work once or twice, it often deters cats from eating that food ever again. Instead, try the steps below, using foods that are NOT their meal.



3. TASTY TREAT PASTE

Find a yummy treat paste your cat enjoys. Test a variety of flavors and brands to ID the best one for YOUR cat! I like Churu paste by Inaba (Check Tractor Supply). (note: Tuna is often ineffective but whipped cream may work).



4. FAMILIARITY

Cats can be suspicious of new foods. Help familiarize by putting a dollop in a bowl they've eaten from before. Repeat multiple times across a few days until they eat it without hesitation.



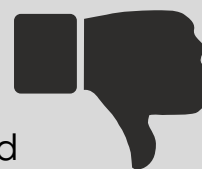
5. EMPTY CAPSULE

Get empty, clear capsules in the smallest size that will hold your cat's meds. Place an empty cap in bowl from step 4, cover with paste, and offer to cat.



6. TROUBLESHOOT

If your cat will not swallow the capsule but did eat the paste, try again, but with just 1/2 the capsule. Repeat until they have eaten 1/2 several times. Then try with a whole (but empty) capsule. Capsules may stick to smooth dishes and be hard to "pick up." Try the above steps with capsule on a textured surface like a rug or scruffy towel.



7. REPEAT

Repeat steps 5 & 6 as needed until your cat can easily eat an entire, empty capsule a few times.



8. THE MEDS

Place the meds inside an empty capsule, close it firmly, then follow the "hiding" process described above.
