

Cat Gate Suggestions

Pressure mounted is most common, and can be placed in most doorways, across hallways or at landings.



Stack as high as needed to contain climbers / jumpers (consider FB Marketplace, yardsales, etc.)



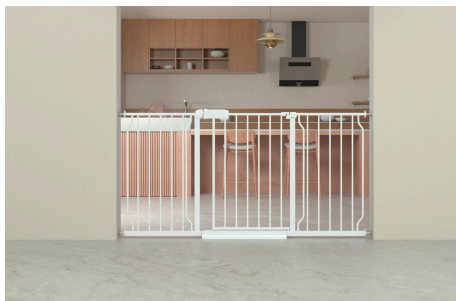
Or purchase extra tall gates.



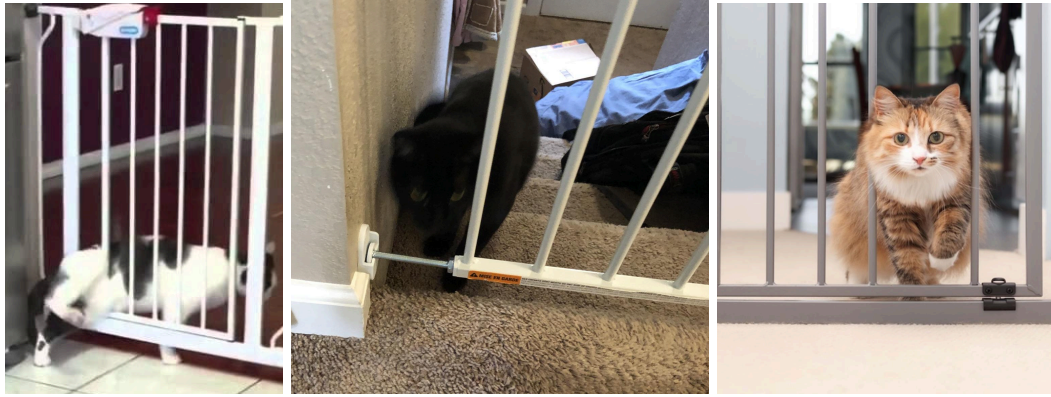

Extra long options are available to traverse wider areas.

Mesh gates typically are not great.



Ensure gaps are appropriate width to contain liquid cats



Consider easy pass-through options with an “airlock” to reduce accidental escapes



Repurposed screen doors and other DIY options can be found online



Thick or layered blankets, towels, or sheets can be great visual covers. Thin fabric may allow shadows/silhouettes. Binder clips, tape, magnets, zip ties, etc. can help prevent cats from squeezing between the cover and gate. Cardboard is a great visual block and can be used to quickly “cut off” all visual access if conflict arises during exposure training.
